2. All entries to have been completed in the last two (2) years
3. Collections to be sewn or pinned together to avoid being lost.
4. All possible care and attention is taken with all entered exhibits, but the Boonah Show Society accepts NO responsibility for missing or damaged articles.
5. Work not to be washed, unless it is part of the work process..
6. Worn, used or soiled work will not be accepted.
7. All entries must be hand-worked by the named exhibitor, unless otherwise stated.
8. In all classes the judge will take into consideration the quality of the work in making the awards, which may result in NO 1st prize being awarded. All prizes are awarded at the Judges discretion, and are final.
9. All junior exhibitors are required to enter their date of birth on their entry forms to ensure they are placed in the correct class.
10. No more than two (2) entries allowed for each exhibitor in each class.
11. If an item is entered in the incorrect class, the head stewards will re-class it.

RULES & CONDITIONS OF ENTRY.

Please obtain the “Natural Fibres Creations & Wearable Art” Booklet from the Stewards or Show Secretary for the full terms & conditions of entry.

This booklet also contains the correct entry forms which must be used.

First & Second Place winners from the following classes are eligible to represent Boonah Show Society at the State Finals to be held at the Exhibition in August.

“NATURAL FIBRES CREATIONS” RESTRICTED CLASSES**CLASS 1. “SELF MADE” - JUNIOR SCHOOL** (Grades 5 –9 Inclusive.)

- Outfit can be for any occasion **except swimwear or sleepwear.**
- Garment is to be cut and sewn by the entrant. May receive advise on how to complete.

CLASS 2. SENIOR SCHOOL :- (Grades 10 –12 inclusive)

- Outfit can be for any occasion **except swimwear or sleepwear.**
- Garment is to be cut and sewn by the entrant.

CLASS 3. OPEN “KIDS IN NATURAL FIBRES” Entrant may be any age, but outfit must be for a boy or girl aged 7 –15 years inclusive.

- Suitable for any occasion including formal wear (no swimwear or sleepwear).
- Slacks and shirt, skirt and blouse or dress, formal wear, shorts and shirt, sports uniform or play wear.

CLASS 4 – OPEN – ADULT RECYCLE AND RE-CREATE (This is not a Wearable Art Class)

- Entrant must either use an existing old garment or purchase a garment from a second hand store. The entrant must photograph this old outfit (colour) and attach the photograph of the original garment to their entry form.

CLASS 5. OPEN “ADULT DAY WEAR” (not casual wear)

- Suitable for Race Meeting, Business Meeting, Garden Party, Wedding or any other non casual daytime occasion.
- A sample swatch of each fabric used must be attached to the entry form.

CLASS 6: BIRCH CREATIVE OPEN - “ADULT - FORMAL WEAR”

- Suitable for After 5, Cocktail, Wedding Dress, Ball , Black Tie event, Opening Night or any formal evening occasion (not sleepwear).
- A sample swatch of each fabric used must be attached to the entry form.

CLASS 7: OPEN – ADULT - CALICO CAPERS—Any Occasion See the entry forms for full details for this class.

- All entries in this class must be made from 1 no more than 120cm wide, medium weight 100% calico. No other fabric can be used in upper garment. (Only exceptions is linings & petticoats)
- Outfit can be for any occasion including day, evening and bridal wear.
- A sample swatch of each fabric used must be attached to the entry form.

CLASS 8: OPEN -ADULT CASUAL/ACTIVE WEAR

- Suitable for any casual day wear. Eg. Barbecue, pool party, a day at the beach, sports uniforms or supporters’ outfit, gym wear, Resort wear, Swimwear including over garment. (No sleepwear).
- Eg. Jeans and top, track suits, swimwear (made from natural fabrics) and over garment eg sarong , slacks and top, t shirt and shorts, sports uniforms, romper suits – anything relaxing.
